Housing Scams

Signs of a Scam:

- 1. No one can show you the rental
- 2. No one can meet you in person and you don't know who the owner is.
- 3. It sounds too good to be true
- 4. The listing has poor grammar
- 5. The person is asking you to wire money
- 6. There is no lease to show
- 7. Having payments in cash
- 8. Ask you for your financial information
- 9. Limited background information

Suggestions:

- 1. Avoid dealing with a middleman
- 2. Do your research about a place
- 3. Look at current market rates
- 4. Make sure platforms verify users
- 5. Talk to current or previous tenants
